CONSTITUTION

1. NAME

The name of the organisation shall be "The Glasgow Chess League" and in this Constitution shall be referred to as the "League".

2. OBJECT

The object of the league shall be to foster chess in Glasgow and the surrounding districts.

3. MEMBERSHIP

The League shall consist of two classes of membership, namely: -

3.1 Full Members,

3.2 Associate Members.

4. QUALIFICATION FOR MEMBERSHIP

4.1 Full Member: Any club domiciled in or near Glasgow.

4.2 Associate Membership: Any individual who is a member of a club in full membership of the League.

5. ELECTION OF MEMBERS

5.1 The election of clubs to full membership and individuals to Associate Membership shall be by the Management Committee.

5.2 The Management Committee shall have the right to refuse membership and shall not be bound to give reasons for such rejection.

6. ENTRANCE FEES, SUBSCRIPTIONS & HONORARIA

6.1 Full Members shall pay annual subscriptions, which shall be determined by the League Council.

6.2 Annual subscriptions shall become due on 1st November each year.

6.3 Any Full Member whose subscription is in arrears after 1st November shall be liable to a financial surcharge of not more than 100% as determined by the Management Committee.

6.4 Any Full Member whose subscription is three months in arrears shall cease to be a Full Member. Associate Members whose club ceases to be a Full Member shall themselves cease to be members of the League.

6.5 The Secretary and other office bearers may, at the discretion of the League Council, be paid fees for services rendered to the League. The League Council at the Annual Meeting shall determine the amounts of fees.

7. COUNCIL

The governing body of the League shall be called the Council and shall consist of the League President, the Secretary, the Treasurer and one delegate from each Full Member of the League.

8. ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING OF THE COUNCIL

The Annual General Meeting of the Council shall be held in the month of MAY each year in order to: -

- 8.1 Receive the President's report.
- 8.2 Receive the Annual Report from the Secretary and receive the Statement of Account from the Treasurer.
- 8.3 Elect the President, the Secretary, the Treasurer and other members of the Management Committee for the ensuing year.
- 8.4 Appoint the Auditor for the ensuing year.
- 8.5 Fix the Annual Subscription.
- 8.6 Transact any further business.

9. SPECIAL MEETINGS OF THE COUNCIL

A special meeting of the Council shall be convened on a resolution of the Management Committee, or on requisition signed by 10 Full Members. The requisition shall specify the business to be transacted and the Secretary shall hold the special meeting within 4 weeks from the date of receipt of the requisition.

10. NOTICE OF COUNCIL MEETINGS

At least 21 days written notice shall be given of all meetings of the Council. The notice shall specify the hour, date and venue of the meeting and state the business to be transacted.

11. CHAIRMAN OF COUNCIL MEETINGS

At all meetings of the Council the President shall take the chair, or in his absence, the meeting shall appoint a chairman.

12. QUORUM FOR COUNCIL MEETINGS

Ten members of the Council shall form a quorum.

13. ATTENDANCE AND VOTING AT COUNCIL MEETINGS

- 13.1 Any member of the League may attend but Associate Members may not be entitled to participate in the business conducted unless invited by the Chairman.
- 13.2 At Council meetings the League President and the delegates of each club in Full Membership of the League shall be entitled to cast one vote.
- 13.3 All questions shall be settled by a bare majority of votes.
- 13.4 In the event of equality of votes the Chairman shall have a casting vote.

14. AUDITOR

The Annual Meeting of the Council shall appoint for one year of office an Auditor who shall not be a member of the Management Committee.

15. MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

The Management Committee shall conduct the affairs of the League in accordance with the articles of the Constitution (and from time-to-time enforce). The Council may override any decision of the Management Committee. The Management Committee shall consist of the President, the Secretary, the Treasurer and 7 members of the League. The Management Committee shall have the power to appoint subcommittees from its members and to co-opt onto any sub-committee so appointed such persons, as it may deem necessary for the satisfactory handling of the Leagues affairs. The Management Committee has the power to appoint League and Tournament Controllers, as it may deem necessary. The Management Committee shall have power to prescribe such standing orders, as it may deem necessary for the regulation of the business of its subcommittees. The Management Committee shall be responsible for arranging the various competitions sponsored by the League. The Management Committee shall be authorised to approve the expenditure of money on behalf of the League for any purpose, which it deems necessary.

16. CHAIRMAN OF MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE & SUBCOMMITTEE MEETINGS

The President shall take the chair at all Management Committee or sub-committee meetings, or in his absence, the meeting shall appoint a Chairman.

17. QUORUM FOR MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE & SUBCOMMITTEE

The quorum for a Management Committee meeting shall be four members and for a subcommittee not less than half of the number comprising the sub-committee.

18. VOTING AT COMMITTEE MEETINGS

Each member of the Management Committee or a subcommittee meeting shall have one vote. Questions arising at any meeting shall be decided by a majority of votes. In the case of equality of votes the Chairman shall have a second or casting vote.

19. NOMINATION FOR ELECTION OF THE MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

Nominations for election to the Management Committee shall be made in writing to the Secretary to be received not less than 7 days before the Annual General Meeting. Nominations shall bear the signature of the proposer, together with the written consent of the nominee or nominees who must be Associate Members of the League.

20. ELECTION OF MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

Elections to the Management Committee shall be made at the Annual General Meeting. Members of the Management Committee, who shall be eligible for re-election shall be elected for a term of one year. For this and other purposes a year of the League is defined as the period between the closure of two successive Annual General Meetings. The Management Committee shall have the power to fill any casual vacancy (except that of President). A person so appointed shall serve for the remainder of his predecessor's office.

21. INTERPRETATION OF CONSTITUTION

In the event of a disagreement arising as to the correct interpretation of the constitution of the League, the Council's ruling shall be final.

22. AMENDMENT TO CONSTITUTION

The constitution, also the Rules for League Competitions and Rules of Play appended thereto, may be amended at a Council Meeting on a majority vote provided the proposed amendment is included in the notice calling the meeting. The proposed amendment must be delivered to the Secretary not later than the 31st March if it is to be included in the notice calling the Annual General Meeting.

RULES for LEAGUE COMPETITIONS

1. DURATION OF SEASON

League competitions comprising one or more divisions shall be held in each season. For this and other purposes "a season" is defined as the period commencing on SEPTEMBER 1st in one year and terminating on APRIL 30th in the following year.

2. CONSTITUTION OF DIVISIONS AND MATCH FIXTURES

- 2.1 There shall be no more than thirteen teams in each section of the lowest Division. All Divisions above shall have ten teams.
- 2.2 New teams shall enter the lowest Division.
- 2.3 Each team within a Division shall play one match with each of the other teams therein during the playing season. However if a Division contains less than eight teams, then each team shall play two matches with each of the other teams.
- 2.4 When a club has more than one team in the same Division, the teams shall play each other at the start of the Season. If such matches have not been played by the third match and neither team has claimed a default, then it shall be deemed to be a double default.
- 2.5 When a club has more than 1 team, then they shall be called (in order of overall playing strength and division they play in) A, B, C etc

3 SCORING

- 3.1 The individual games of a match shall be scored, one game point for a game won, half game point for a game drawn, no games point for a game lost.
- 3.2 Based upon the aggregate of individual game points gained by each team the results of a match shall be scored, 2 points for a match won, 1 point for a match drawn, no points for a match lost.

4 GAMES LOST BY DEFAULT

- 4.1 One match point shall be deducted from a team's score at the end of the Season for every four games lost by default.
- 4.2 If 50% or more of a side is prevented from attending a match by some unforeseeable event the Management Committee may, at their discretion, rule that the defaults so incurred be excluded from the total for the purpose of this clause.

5. TEAM WITHDRAWALS

The following action shall be taken if a team withdraws from a division during a Season. Match results cancelled if less than 50% matches played, or match results to stand if 50% or more of matches played. Unplayed matches to be scored wins for opposing teams.

6 PROMOTION AND RELEGATION

- 6.1 The Divisions of the League shall function on the following promotion and relegation basis.
- (a) The two teams in all divisions except the first securing the greatest number of match points shall be promoted to the next higher division.
 - (b) If, after promotion, the number of teams in division 1 should exceed the specified strength then the extra team or teams with the smallest number of match points shall be relegated to division 2. Should this relegation, in turn, cause the number of teams in division 2 to exceed the specified strength then the extra team or teams with the smallest number of match points shall be relegated to division 3 and so on throughout all the divisions except the lowest division.
 - (c) If, during the application of the relegation process, a division is found to be under-strength then the leading placed teams in the next lower division shall fill the vacancy or vacancies.
 - (d) When the lowest division is divided into two or more sections the Management Committee may arrange play-off matches to decide the promotion issue. Occasionally, to accommodate variations in the number of registered teams the number of divisions may be altered. If the number of teams in the lowest division exceeds 26 then an extra division may be created. If the number of teams in the lowest division is less than 7 then the lowest division will be combined with the next lowest division, which may then be divided into sections.
- 6.2 If two or more teams concerned in promotion or relegation are equal in match points, then the Issue shall be resolved by applying the following rules in their order of numbering:
- (a) The teams shall be placed in order of the total games-for points scored.
 - (b) If the issue remains un-resolved, then those teams that are tied on total games-for points after applying rule (a) shall be placed in order of the match points scored between the teams.
 - (c) Should the issue still remain undecided then a match or a series of matches between the teams that are tied shall resolve the matter. These matches are to be played on dates and at venues arranged by the Management Committee.
 - (d) In the event that any match played under rule (c) is drawn then the result shall be decided as follows, the score at each board in the match shall be cancelled board by board, beginning at the bottom board, until one team has a majority of games-for points.
- 6.3 Other than when it would result in a club having more than 2 teams in one division, promotion will normally be obligatory. However in exceptional circumstances, the Management Committee may use discretionary powers in favour of a club(s) applying to forego elevation to a higher division. Should a club, following relegation have more than two teams in one division, the club may opt to have its junior team relegated to the next lowest division.

- 6.4 A team in any division except the lowest division defaulting two or more matches during the season shall be relegated to the next lower division unless a satisfactory explanation is given to the Management Committee within 21 days of the scheduled match. Similarly, teams in the lowest division defaulting two or more matches during the season without satisfactory explanation shall be ineligible for promotion.

7 CONSTITUTION OF TEAMS

- 7.1 Teams in the first 2 divisions will consist of 8 players.
7.2 Teams in the 3rd Division will consist of 6 players. When the league extends to 6 or more divisions then the 4th Division will also consist of 6 teams.
7.3 Teams in any remaining divisions will consist of 4 players.

8 PLAYER ELIGIBILITY

- 8.1 No player shall be eligible to play for more than one club, or for more than one team in the same division, during the season.
8.2 A player may play a total of three times in divisions higher than the lowest in which they have played. A player is not tied to the division in which they first play.
8.3 Any dispute as to the eligibility of a player shall be referred to the Management Committee whose decision shall be final

9. REGISTRATION OF PLAYERS

Registration is only required for players who are not published in the most recent copy of the grading list. Clubs must provide full details to the league controller of all new players or players returning after a period of inactivity. Full details means full name, including middle initials, and date of birth if under 21. It should be indicated if the player has a current grading from another country or from FIDE. A returning player is one who previously played competitive chess in Scotland and may have a previous grade or a Chess Scotland player number. Registration of a returning player should provide an estimation of when the player was previously active and for which club. A match result will not be officially recorded for a team unless they have complied with supplying information on new or returning players.

10. PENALTIES

For a breach of Rules 8 and/or 9 the offending team shall incur a penalty up to and including forfeiture of the match.

11. VENUES AND DATES FOR MATCHES

- 11.1 All clubs should play League matches at a suitable venue within 10 miles radius of Exchange Square in Glasgow unless the home team can obtain agreement from visiting clubs. Such visiting clubs, declining to play outside the 10-mile radius or at an unsuitable venue must do so at the League Fixture Meeting.

- 11.2 League matches shall be played on weekdays (i.e. Monday - Friday) and on dates stated in the League Fixture List. A match date may be changed, but only in exceptional circumstances by mutual agreement between the clubs concerned and provided that the new date is approved by the controller.
- 11.3 Fixtures shall be arranged at the given meeting. A minimum of one third (1/3) of each team's matches must be scheduled before 1st January.

12 RULES FOR MATCHES

- 12.1 All matches shall be played in accordance with the Rules of Play currently in force.
- 12.2 The FIDE Laws of Chess shall apply, except where superseded by special rules of play described herein.
- 12.3 The following provision shall apply in all Glasgow Chess League team matches: If a player's mobile phone rings in the playing venue during his / her game, then his / her opponent shall be awarded an extra two minutes thinking time. If the same player's phone rings again in the playing venue during the same game, that player will then lose the game. His/her opponent will be awarded a win, regardless of the position on the board.

12. COMPETITION MANAGEMENT AND RESOLUTION OF DISPUTES

The Management Committee shall manage the League competitions and settle all disputes and questions arising therein. See Dispute Procedures.

RULES of PLAY

1. CONDITIONS OF PLAY

Unless agreed otherwise, a team match shall commence at a starting time nominated by the home team. All clocks shall be started at this time. The starting time must be between 7.15pm and 7.45pm. It shall be notified to the League Secretary at the start of the season, and be published with the Fixture List. There shall be no smoking in the Playing Room.

2. TEAM DECLARATION AND PLAYING ORDER

- 2.1 The match captains (or their deputies) of opposing teams shall, five minutes before the commencement of the match, exchange lists of their players in descending order of playing strength.
- 2.2 Except for the provision laid down in Clause 4 (below), no rearrangement of playing order is permitted after team lists have been exchanged.
- 2.3 Any blatant infringement of this rule concerning order of playing strength shall be considered by the Management Committee and may incur penalties extending as far as the loss of two match points.

3. CHOICE OF COLOUR

After team lists have been exchanged the match captains shall toss for choice of move at board 1 and the move at the remaining boards shall alternate accordingly.

4. SUBSTITUTES

- 4.1 If a player has not arrived 60 minutes after the official starting time his game shall be lost by default unless, before expiry of this period, a substitute has been put into the team.
- 4.2 Any player so substituted is not eligible to play in the match in question.

5. CLOCKS AND RATE OF PLAY

- 5.1 It shall be obligatory to use clocks in all divisions.
- 5.2 The rate of play shall be 30 moves in the first 60 minutes followed by 15 minutes each quickplayfinish rules in all divisions.

6. NOTIFICATION OF MATCH RESULTS

- 6.1 The Division Controller must be notified of the result of a match by the match captain of each team within 7 days of the date on which it is played.
- 6.2 The notification must give the names of the players in **BLOCK LETTERS** with the scores achieved.
- 6.3 Defaulted games should be indicated with a (D) in the result column.
- 6.4 Division Controllers are empowered to impose penalty match points should a team fail to report results within 28 days of the match, up to a maximum of one penalty match point for each four unreported game results.

6.5 If no agreement can be reached, games concluded in Quickplay finishes under Appendix D of the Laws of Chess should be sent to the Division Controller accompanied by a £20.00 fee per team per position. The fee will be returned to the successful claimant.

7. RIGHTS OF MATCH CAPTAINS

- A match captain is not permitted to intervene during play except that he/she is authorised to:
- 7.1 Resolve any problems that might occur during the match in conjunction with the opposing match captain.
 - 7.2 Call flag-fall if this occurs.
 - 7.3 Advise any of his players to make or accept the offer of a draw, but not claim a draw, provided he does so in the presence of the opposing match captain.

DISPUTES PROCEEDURE (N.B. See Rules of Play 6.5)

- 1 In the first instance clubs should endeavour to resolve their disputes by negotiation between their nominated representatives and the Division Controller.
- 2 Failing agreement each club must within 21 days of the dispute arising refer the dispute in writing to the Division Controller. The respective club secretaries will be notified by letter of the date when the dispute will be heard by a panel of the Management Committee.
- 3 The panel may invite clubs to:
 - 3.1 Present their case by written submission and/or
 - 3.2 Arrange for persons to appear before the panel to speak on matters relevant to the dispute.
 - 3.3 The clubs involved will be notified in writing of the decision of the Management Committee.

GLASGOW JUNIOR CHESS LEAGUE

- 1 All the rules of the Glasgow Chess League, except where modified hereafter, apply. This includes, if necessary, multiple divisions, promotion and relegation.
- 2 There will be no promotion to the main league.
- 3 Clubs who are members of the Glasgow Chess league may enter teams. The fee this year will be £5.00 per team.
- 4 Teams will consist of 4 Players
- 5 Eligible players will be j17 (as per the grading list) or younger and graded below 1200 and registered with the Glasgow Chess League, as per the rules.
- 6 Players may also play in the main league according to the rules, separate registration is not wanted.
- 7 The starting time and venue for matches are as stated by the club in the league handbook in accordance with existing league practice.
- 8 The time control for matches will be 45 minutes to each player for all moves.
- 9 Rapidplay Rules will apply, but it is hoped that moves will be recorded. It is hoped that clubs will provide a non-playing adult captain to interpret league rules.

QUICKPLAY RULES

A game with a quickplay finish is NOT the same as a Blitz or Rapidplay game, and certain rules are designed to prevent a player from winning on time when the position on the board does not justify it.

- 1 A 'quickplay finish' is the last phase of a game, when all the remaining moves must be made in a limited time.
2. A player may claim a draw when he has less than two minutes left on his clock and before his flag falls. This concludes the game. He may claim on the basis
 - (a) that his opponent cannot win by normal means, or
 - (b) that his opponent has been making no effort to win by normal means.

In (a) the player must write down the final position and his opponent verify it.

In (b) the player must write down the final position and submit an up-to-date scoresheet which must be completed before play has ceased. The opponent shall verify both the scoresheet and the final position.

The team captains shall attempt to agree the outcome of the game.

Failing agreement, the claim shall be referred to the League whose decision shall be final.

- 3 Illegal moves do not necessarily lose. After the action taken under (FIDE) Article 7.4, for a first illegal move by a player the arbiter shall give two minutes extra time to his opponent; for a second illegal move by the same player the arbiter shall give another two minutes extra time to his opponent; for a third illegal move by the same player, the arbiter shall declare the game lost by the player who played incorrectly.
- 4 If both flags have fallen and it is impossible to establish which flag fell first the game is drawn.

RAPIDPLAY RULES

- B1. A 'rapidplay game' is one where all the moves must be made in a fixed time between 15 to 60 minutes. B2. The FIDE Laws of Chess shall govern play, except where they are overridden by the following Laws.
- Recording Moves*
- B3. Players do not need to record the moves.
- Illegal Moves*
- B4. Once each player has made three moves, no claim can be made regarding incorrect piece placement, orientation of the chessboard or clock setting.
- 10.3 Illegal moves do not necessarily lose. After the action taken under article 7.4 (*restoring position*) for a first illegal move by a player the arbiter shall give two minutes extra time to his opponent; for a second illegal move by the same player the arbiter shall give another two minutes extra time to his opponent; for a third illegal move by the same player, the arbiter shall declare the game lost by the player who played incorrectly.
- Arbiter Intervention*
- B5. The arbiter shall make a ruling according to Articles 4 (touch move) and 10 (Quickplay finish), only if requested to do so by one or both players.
- Claiming a Draw*
- 10.2 A player may claim a draw when he has less than two minutes left on his clock and before his flag falls. This concludes the game. He may claim on the basis
- (a) that his opponent cannot win by normal means, or
 - (b) that his opponent has been making no effort to win by normal means.
- The player must write down the final position and his opponent verify it. The team captains shall attempt to agree the outcome of the game. Failing agreement, the claim shall be referred to the League whose decision shall be final.
- Flagfall*
- B6. The flag is considered to have fallen when a valid claim to that effect has been made by a player. The arbiter shall refrain from signalling a flag fall.
- B7. To claim a win on time, the claimant must stop both clocks and notify the arbiter. For the claim to be successful, the claimant's flag must remain up and his opponent's flag down after the clocks have been stopped.
- B8. If both flags have fallen, the game is drawn.
- (The numbers at the beginning refer to Article 10 and Appendix B of the FIDE Laws of Chess)**

RAPIDPLAY LEAGUE

- 1 The Glasgow Rapidplay Chess League will be a team event with four players per team. Matches will take place between October & April on one evening each month at a Central venue (Clubs to be notified). Clubs are invited to submit team(s) to participate in an All-Play-All League format depending on the response of the number of teams involved.
- 2 F.I.D.E. Rapid play rules will apply.
- 3 Rules for League Competition & Rules of Play are detailed within the Glasgow Chess League Handbook, except where modified as below
- 4 Each team is responsible for providing two complete chess sets, boards & three (3) clocks for use during matches.
- 5 A schedule will be sent to all competing teams. Play and games shall commence at 7.30pm with the first named team having White on board one. Followed immediately by the second game against the same opponent with colours reversed. The time control will be (15/30) minutes per player for all moves. The numbers are based on a Ten-team division, but this time control may increase if numbers are less.
- 6 Scoring will be fully on game points not match points. A won game will score 1 point, a drawn game ½ point and loss zero points.
- 7 Any disputes arising shall be settled by the organisers (or their representatives) whose decision is final. Teams are expected to compete in a spirit of fair play and cooperation.
- 8 Cost per team shall be that of the lowest division, plus a deposit both to be determined by the Glasgow Chess League at the A.G.M.
- 9 Teams defaulting a match without giving reasonable explanation lose their deposit.
- 10 Teams defaulting on more than one evening or withdrawing from the rapidplay league without giving reasonable explanation, shall be restricted to the number of teams completing the league, for the following two seasons.

A.K. MILLER CUP RULES(Rapidplay Rules)

1. **BASIC TOURNAMENT RULES** Each team shall consist of four players who must be bona fide members of their League team as defined in Clause 8 of the Rules for League Competitions. However, players who normally play in lower divisions may join higher division teams.
2. **COLOUR ALLOCATION** In each team the colours given to individual players alternate from board 1 down. Match captain's toss for choice of colour/move at board 1.
3. **SCORING AND NOTIFICATION OF RESULTS** The scoring at each board is 1 point for a win; ½ point for each player for a draw; zero for a loss.
4. Points shall be added to a team's aggregate score in accordance with the following scale: -
Division 1 teams ..0 Division 2 teams ..½ Division 3 teams ..1 Division 4 teams ..1½ Division 5 teams ..2 Division 6 teams ..2½
5. **THE TIME HANDICAP CALCULATIONS SHOULD BE MADE AS FOLLOWS: -**
If grading difference is less than 10 points, both competitors will have 75 Minutes on the clock to complete the game.
6. For each ten grading points' difference, add 1 minute to the time of the lower graded player and deduct 1 minute from the time of the higher graded player.
7. The higher graded player cannot have less than 20 minutes. Ungraded players will be graded at 1400 for handicap purposes.
8. **AK Miller: -** clock times set at 4.45pm for a 6.00pm finish.
Difference = grade difference (rounded up to the nearest ten); High = time set for higher graded player; Low = time set for lower graded player.

9. If, after applying Rule 4, the teams in a match have equal scores then the result of the game at each board shall be cancelled, board by board, beginning at board 4, until one team has a majority of points. Should this action fail to produce a result then the match is to be immediately replayed under the same rules except that each player must make all his moves in 5 minutes. Should this fail to produce a result then the home team captain shall toss a coin

- 10 The result of the match must be reported to the Tournament Controller within five days of the match date. Otherwise the tie will be declared a double default.
- 11 **NEW TEAMS** Shall be classified as division 4 teams for handicap purposes until a season has passed in which they have failed to gain promotion or until they have reached division 4.
12. **THE CLOCK** Each player must make all his moves in the time prescribed by the above rules, and therefore the RapidPlay rules apply.
